Joining Ms Tabart at the event will be Adrian Cropley ABC, the international Chair of IABC.

Mr Cropley is the first Australian to lead the IABC as it supports over 15,000 business communicators around the world.

"I am delighted that Adrian Cropley will be attending on Wednesday, I think communication is so important in business and it makes me very proud to see Australians receiving international recognition for their skills", said Ms Tabart.
